### **Course Description**

This course introduces the fundamental scientific knowledge about human thinking and behavior processes and illustrates the relevance of this knowledge to the betterment of human performance and well-being in a wide variety of settings in the society.

Upon completion of this course, students are expected to:

1. recognize some fundamental scientific concepts about human mind and behavior;
2. analyze human performance and wellbeing in various social settings with reference to these concepts; AND
3. explain how scientific research on human mind and behavior is conducted.

### 1. Mid-Term Quiz (30%)

- Mid-Term Quiz will be administered to test your understanding of course materials. The quiz will include multiple-choice questions only (The relevant chapters will appear on the last page of the lecture handouts).

- Supplementary readings are also listed in the lecture note but they will NOT be included in the quizzes. These readings are useful for a deeper understanding in the course contents.

- No make-up quizzes will be given to students who are absent from the examination unless students can provide validated medical reasons. ### 2. Assignment 1 & 2 (15% x 2)

- Task: You are required to complete two assignments. The first assignment is about **Learning** and the second one is about **Social Psychology**. For each assignment, you have to write a maximum of 500 words to demonstrate your understanding of the topic.
- The guidelines for the assignments will be uploaded on Canvas in due course. Please read and follow the instructions carefully. Deadline: **Assignment 1 is due on Oct 10** and **Assignment 2 is due on Nov 23**.

### 3. Research Experience (10%)

- To allow you to gain first-hand experience in psychological research you are required to complete the following **TWO** tasks,

#### Task 1 Participate in-class activities (5%)

- There will be in-class activities and students are required to complete survey/exercise during **Tutorial 2 and 3**.

#### Task 2 Either Research Study OR Video Exercise (5%)

- *Research Study*: Complete an experimental study as a participant and write a thought piece about your experience (within 200 to 300 words).
- *Video Exercise*: Watch a video about a research study and write a thought piece about it (within 200 to 300 words).
- Further information about Research study or Video Exercise will be provided in **Tutorial 1**.

#### 4. Final Quiz (30%)

- Final quiz will be administered to test your understanding of course materials. The exam will include multiple-choice questions only and non-cumulative (The relevant chapters will appear on the last page of the lecture handouts).
- The final quiz is scheduled on **Nov 29** and covers topics from **Week 7 to 13**.
- Supplementary readings are also listed in the lecture note but they will NOT be included in the exam. These readings are useful for a deeper understanding in the course contents.
- No make-up quizzes will be given to students who are absent from the examination unless students can provide validated medical reasons.
