Class Participation (10%)

Item	Task	Description
#1	Case Analysis (30%)	Using the Trait Approach, each group is to prepare a case write-up.
#2	Critique (10%)	Each group is to write a critique on an assigned case analysis.

Tests (50%)

- Multiple choice questions. In both tests (25% each), you are responsible for all materials covered in the lectures and REQUIRED readings from the e-textbook.
